# New community garden is 'a place to grow together'

Local people in Hereford have worked with St James Church to create an amazing new community garden, supported by funding from Herefordshire Council's Climate and Nature Grant scheme.

Volunteers built three large raised beds from reclaimed sleepers as well as installing water butts, compost facilities and concrete-free bicycle storage. The project has not only created a beautiful new outdoor space but has also enabled the community and families to enjoy the ever-changing life of a vegetable garden.



Luke Aylen from St James Church said: "The best thing about the project has been bringing people together and thinking about how we as individuals and community love and care for our environment. The new space is therefore all about being a place to grow together - to grow plants and grow our understanding of how to respond to the climate crisis."

Herefordshire Council is launching new funding for community green space and biodiversity projects within Hereford City soon.

### Case study: Listening to older voices in the climate conversation



Herefordshire-based care provider Elgar Care is among the businesses that have signed up to be part of the Greener Footprints '30 for 2030' initiative.
