## **LET'S GO ZERO**

Let's Go Zero provide free support to help schools across the UK become zero carbon by 2030.

Here's a glimpse into what their advisors can offer:

## 1. Sustainability Audit

- Holistic overview of your school's sustainability across over 8 pillars including energy, water, waste, transport, food, procurement, nature and curriculum (approx. 2-4 hours depending on school size)
- b. Engaging with stakeholders across the school incl. SLT, business manager, site manager, subject lead, eco lead, Forest School lead etc. Advisors can also bring students into the process, allowing them to use various auditing equipment such as a thermal imaging camera to identify quick wins for energy efficiency
- c. Climate Action Advisors can use this visit to develop a sustainability report and Climate Action Plan, adhering to the DfE Sustainability and Climate Change strategy, which asks that this document covers the following 4 topics:
  - i. Decarbonisation and Energy Efficiency
  - ii. Climate Adaptation and Resilience
  - iii. Biodiversity and Green Infrastructure
  - iv. Climate Education, Green Skills and Careers

## 2. Count Your Carbon Visit

- a. Support with collating data required and inputting it in tool
- b. Helping to interpret the report generated
- c. Shortlisting actions to use in schools' Climate Action Plans

## FADED LINING OUTSIDE YOUR SCHOOL?



Reporting when road markings outside your school are fading is vital to uphold the safety of children and pedestrians. These markings serve as vital guides for both drivers and pedestrians, ensuring a smooth flow of traffic and outlining safe zones for crossing. Knowing the area is safe encourages pupils and parents to walk, cycle or scoot to school.

Faded markings can lead to confusion, increasing the risk of accidents, especially in areas with high foot traffic like schools.

By reporting fading road markings, the necessary action can be taken for them to be repainted.

Head teacher Chris Bandfield and Deputy Head Caroline Bullock share the exciting projects and plans on the horizon for Ashperton Primary Academy along with how they used their prize money for securing top spot in Herefordshire's Greener Footprints: Our Herefordshire, Our Planet poster competition. Chris explains "We've been very lucky with the timing – we've got the long term lease of a 7 acre field through the amazing support of Ashperton Consolidated Charities, and the field just lends itself to developing a wildflower meadow.
