Last year winning projects involved tree planting, vegetable growing and supporting wildlife on the school grounds. Judges looked for creative and engaging ideas with the power to inspire young people and the wider school community, with a focus on including less advantaged groups in underserved areas.

Following the success of season 1, we are thrilled to announce that season 2 of Street Tag is running from 3 October - 25 November 2024 and it's not too late to join to collect some fantastic prizes for individuals and schools.

Last season saw 16 Herefordshire schools sign up to be part of this virtual competition. Children and families walked, ran, cycled, and rolled over 50,000 miles to collect tags and earn points for their school team. It was Withington Primary School that took the honours in season 1, racking up over 6 million points and earning their £500 prize for the school! A fantastic effort across the whole school with individuals taking top spots on the leaderboard too!

What is Street Tag? Street Tag is a revolutionary app that transforms your community into a virtual playground. By walking, running or cycling participants collect tags, earn

points, and compete on a leaderboard with a chance to win fantastic prizes.

STOP IDLING SIGNS

We have a limited number of 'stop idling and start walking and scooting signs' available for schools – if you would like one please get in touch and we can arrange for one to be delivered to your school. They fit around lamppost or bollard with cable ties.

Car idling outside school gates may seem harmless, but it contributes to air pollution, poses health risks to pupils and residents and creates noise that disrupts the school environment. Walking and scooting to school are great alternatives that foster physical activity and environmental sustainability, improving children's health while reducing traffic congestion and pollution. By

supporting these practices, communities can create a safer and healthier atmosphere for all.

THE TREE COUNCIL GRANT - NOW OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS

The Tree Council grant for community groups, schools, small registered charities and Tree Warden Networks seeking to establish trees, hedgerows, and orchards is now open for applications.



About the Fund

Branching Out supports applications ranging in value from £250 to £2,500, with specific criteria for those under £500, and those above £500. Before you start your application, read the <u>Application Guidance</u>. You will find everything here that you need to know, from the types of trees that qualify, to recommendations around protection.

Access the <u>application form</u> and download the <u>budget sheet and claim form</u> to start the process of transforming your tree planting dream into reality.

The deadline for applications is midnight on Sunday 1 December 2024.
